The 2022-2023 funding proposition for the library’s school district tax support represents an increase of \$23,504 or 3.6%. This translates to approximately 5¢ per \$1,000 of assessed value, or an additional \$4.20 for the median assessed property value of \$84,000.

Important information about the vote:

- Newark Central School District 18 years of age or older may vote.
- You do not have to be registered to vote on or before May 17. You can fill out a form at the voting booth the day of the vote.
- You can vote on the library’s funding proposition on Tuesday, May 17, from 9AM to 8PM at the Newark High School, 625 Peirson Avenue.
- Applications for absentee ballots can be picked up from 9AM to 4PM Monday through Friday at the Newark Central School District Office, 100 East Miller Street. The school district office must receive completed applications at least seven (7) days before the vote and election.
- The library will hold a budget hearing on Thursday, May 12 from 6-6:30PM to allow voters to learn more about the library’s budget and ask questions.
